GEMCLIME – Global Excellence in Modelling of Climate and Energy

University of Economics, Prague

26-27 October 2017

This Conference intends to provide a conducive environment for a comprehensive exchange of ideas concerning new research in **environmental economics** including links to **energy, transport, food, climate, water management, and international environmental relations issues**. Up-to-date **theoretical or empirical research** is in particular encouraged. We especially welcome submissions based on novel econometric techniques, original and extensive datasets, or rigorous study designs. Papers contributing to regulatory impact and with **important policy implications** are also welcome.

Following key issues are of particular interest of this conference:

- energy and climate change economic modelling,
- rigorous analysis of international environmental relations,
- water economics and management.

Doctoral (post-graduate) students and **young researchers** are particularly encouraged to submit their papers.

The papers for the 2017 Conference will be selected on the basis of **extended abstracts (300-500 words)**, which should be structured as follows: (i) overview and research goal(s), (ii) methods and data, and (iii) preliminary results and conclusions. Two kind of sessions will be managed: standard papers presentations (about 20-25 minutes) and discussion interventions (about 10 minutes).

There is **no conference fee**, but each participant will be expected to arrange and pay for their own travel and accommodation. Please, feel free to distribute this call to all who might be interested.
